REFORMATION SUNDAY

On Sunday, October 29, we will hold our annual celebration of the Lutheran Reformation of the Church with a single festival service at 9:00 a.m. Children's Sunday School and the adult/teen Bible class will follow the service. Prof. Harland Goetzinger from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary will be our guest preacher and Bible class presenter. Prof. Goetzinger is the new director of the seminary's Pastoral Studies Institute (PSI), which provides the necessary training for men in nontraditional settings who desire to become pastors. The Bible study hour will be devoted to a special presentation on the seminary's PSI program. Please remember the special schedule for October 29 and join us for worship and the post-service presentation.

KMLHS SUNDAY

Crown of Life's annual Kettle Moraine Lutheran High School Sunday will take place during our regular morning services on October 22. The Traveling Choir from KML will be with us and will sing several anthems during the service.

SUNDAY BIBLE STUDY HOUR PLANS

The Sunday adult/teen Bible class, held between services from 9:25 to 10:15 a.m. in the Timothy Room (fellowship hall), is currently studying the doctrine of vocation from now through October 8.

On October 15, a congregational information meeting will take place during the Bible study time. Leaders from different groups in the congregation will share their plans and receive members' input for their areas of ministry.

Crown of Life member Stacy Stolzman will offer a presentation on October 22 about the Central Africa Medical Mission (CAMM), which is a humanitarian arm of the Lutheran Church of Central Africa (LCCA), a church body that began many decades ago as a WELS mission. Stacy serves in a volunteer position as the Development Director for the CAMM's Stateside Committee.

Prof. Harland Goetzinger from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary (WLS) will be with us on October 29 as our guest preacher and Bible class presenter. His presentation will focus on his work as the seminary's director of the Pastoral Studies Institute (PSI), which provides training to men from a variety of countries and cultures around the world who wish to become pastors in our fellowship. Please note that there is a single service at 9:00 a.m. on October 29, with the presentation following the service.

On the Sundays in November and early December, we will welcome Prof. John Schuetze from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary who will lead us in a study called, "A Christian View of Death." This class will help us to wrestle with difficult but important subjects such as defining what death is, dealing with and preparing for death, euthanasia, advance medical directives, explaining death to children, the final judgment, and what Scripture says about life after death.
