Six Compete at LSA State

Crown of Life had six representatives this year at the Lutheran Sports Association's State T&F meet that took place this past "HOT" Saturday at KMLHS. With only one other meet worth of experience to run on, the athletes struggled to achieve the goals they had set. All managed to complete their events without too many adverse effects from the conditions. The boys 4x100m team (Will Strohm, Johnny Gullickson, Donovan Moore and Barrett Waldvogel) improved on their previous time of 59.09 to run a 57.91 for a 12th place finish, which was only 2.5 seconds off the school record. Hayley Shada set new 6th grade records in the 800m and 1600m as she ran to her fastest performances of 3:06 for 21st place and 6:33 for 17th place in her races. Taylor Rickaby reclaimed the school record in the 1600m when she ran her fastest 1600m finishing in 6:28 in 16th place. Our 8th grade athlete spotlight this week is Barrett Waldvogel who participated in three events. Barrett finished in 17th in the 800 and 14th in the 1600m and ran a leg of the 4x100. This was Barrett's first year at Crown of Life and both the T&F and CC teams were glad to have him on the teams. We wish all of our 8th grade athletes well as they continue their endeavors at

different schools next year and hope to hear that T&F or CC may still be in their futures. RUN FOR LIFE!

Blue Jean Mile!?!?

May is Mental Health Awareness Month. Half of all lifetime mental health conditions begin by age 14. By age 24, 75% of all lifetime conditions begin. Quality nutrition, sleep and exercise habits are linked to improved mental health. The culmination of the 6th-8th graders health class was participation in the ASICS Blue Jean Mile. ASICS is an acronym for the Latin phrase "Anima Sana In Corpore Sano" meaning a healthy mind in a healthy body. Perhaps running a mile on a warm day in blue jeans seems a little crazy, but the 1600m route was marked every 100m with statistics about mental health. Six students accomplished the challenge some running to their fastest mile ever. All are invited to walk the "mile" in school starting and ending at the bulletin board near the gymnasium and learn some of the staggering statistics concerning mental health and view pictures of our event. Then consider going out to join others in running the blue jean mile. Registration of times is free and can be done at www.raceroster.com The world record for the blue jean mile was set last year by Johnny Gregorek who ran it in 4:06.25 as a fundraiser for the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) in the US.
