## 100th Day Excitement

All classes did some amazing things commemorating the 100th day (101th day for Friday classes) last week. Opening with 100 laps in the gym (class team effort) exhausted many. The fastest jump roper in the school accomplished 100 jumps without a miss in 37 seconds. Fourteen were able to jump 100 times without a miss with times ranging from 37 seconds to 1:13. A team of 5th/6th graders made 100 baskets in 3:35 while a team of 7th/8th made 101 in 3:21. ## Second-Third Grade News

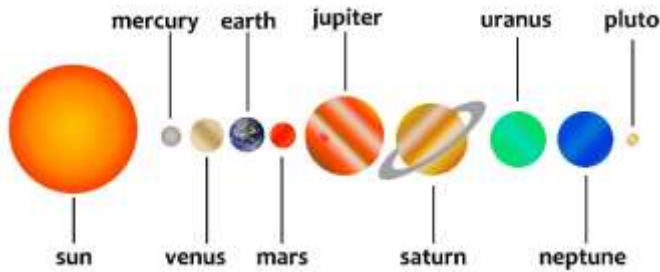
This week we are really excited to be practicing our play. We are learning our lines and learning about stage directions.
