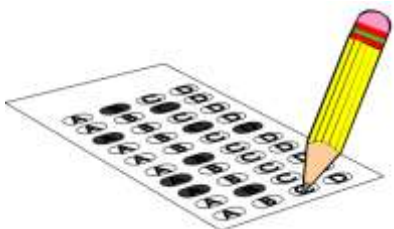
Fourth Grade News
