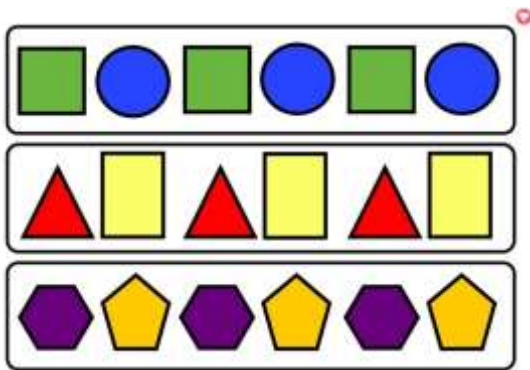
Church Music

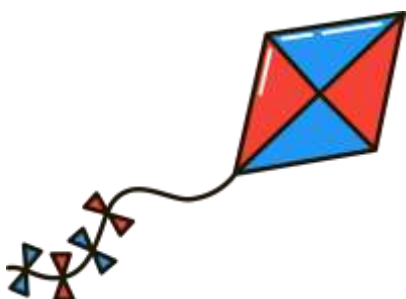


5K-First Grade News

Fourth Grade News

It's the last week of April already! Time is going fast. For this week, memory treasures include Matthew 28:19-20, Matthew 18:20, and Hymn 681:1. Bible lessons to study are Jesus' Ascension and Matthias Replaces Judas. Math class has started a chapter on measurement for both the customary and the metric system. In grammar, the students will be moving into simple, comparative, and superlative adjectives. Also, starting this week, spelling tests move to Thursdays. Please note this change is for the rest of this school year.

A bigger project coming in May is a living wax museum. In social studies, the students are researching a state. So for writing class, the students will pick someone famous from this state, research and write a paper about them, and then tell their story to everyone who comes to visit our museum presentation.
