## CC Races Twice Last Week

The CC teams conquered the KML course on Wednesday and then soared at the Lutheran State meet Saturday. The competitive event at KML and state were both two miles in length. The girls fielded a team in the competitive two mile division and took 3rd place of ten teams with 82 points at KML. Violet and Kendall medaled for top ten finishes (3rd & 10th). Morning Star won with 49 points and DASH was awarded second one point ahead of the Colts with 81 points. Five Colts set new personal records with Rosalie Grivno's most impressive 1:47 improvement. Three days later the teams raced at Concordia University for the Lutheran State Competition hosting 225 boys and 185 girls from 47 schools. This was the first time COL hosted a complete boys' team. The more complete teams in attendance, the more teams get to qualify for the national Lutheran meet. In this intensely competitive run in windy conditions, Ephraim Klemann ran the two miles to a new personal best dropping nine seconds off his previous time. Our young team finished in 21st position of 21 teams but gained valuable experience for future years. For the second year in a row the girls finished in 3rd place and qualified to race at Nationals on October 21. Violet and Kendall were honored to 2nd team all state for 8th and 13th place finishes. The girls scored 114 points. Six girls ran personal bests improving as follows: Natalie 19 seconds, Gavi 28, Violet 31, Kendall 49, Aubrey 50, and Leah 53. The girls' race will take place at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 21. This will be their third National appearance having finished 10th in 2021 and 6th in 2022.

## CC Travels to Greenfield Park

Participants in Friday's WLC CC Challenge, October 13, will be dismissed at 2:20 for a 2:30 departure time. This meet takes place in Greenfield Park off of Lincoln and 123rd. Girls race at 4:30 and boys at 5:00. Athletes needed to qualify to participate in the Challenge meet. Qualification standards were placing in the top 40% of a Varsity Race. One boy and five girls will be representing COL at this premiere event.

## Third and Fourth Grade News

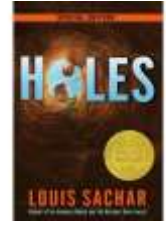
