The second semester mission offerings will be gathered to support the WELS program 100 Missions in 10 Years. The goal is to start 100 new missions and enhance 75 existing ones in the 10 years from 2023-2033. According to the Home Missions Chairman for WELS, Pastor Mark Gaab, "This initiative isn't as much about planting more churches but about sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ. **It's about aggressively reaching lost souls.** It's about Christ's mission to his church." That is certainly something we want to do as we are *saved to serve*.

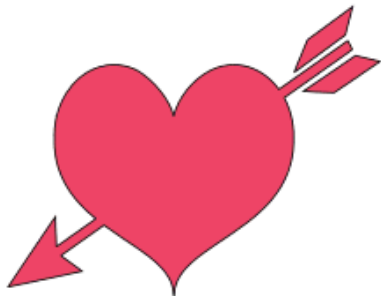
