A few items this week

1. Call Issued - This last Sunday we issued a call to Rachel Berger to be our Preschool Director and lead teacher. She and her husband, Colton, live in Andover, MN, with their two children. 2. We will be opening enrollment for the 2024-2025 school year starting on March 1st. Please go onto our website to get the process started, but do not make any payments until after July 1.

3. There will be a tuition increase for the 2024-2025 school year. We will be raising tuition \$200 a student. Much of the additional funding will go towards an additional teacher for next year. We also offer tuition assistance for all members at Crown of Life. So if this is a hardship please contact Mr. Stoltz to get details as to how we can help make this affordable.



4. Crown of Life is a Choice School that started back in the 2021-22 school year. If you are interested in being a Choice family please look at the following information.

Did you know that if your child becomes a Choice School child that all education from Pre-K thru 12th grade (KML) is paid for? See if you qualify. Students must be going into 4K, 5K, and 1st grade to qualify.
