CC Teams Excel

Nineteen Colts ran in the Timbercat CC Invite last Wednesday at Living Word High School. Course length was 1.5 miles and 21 schools were in attendance. Seventeen COLTS ran to PR performances which ranged from 1 second to Mason Schellinger's 1:21 improvement. Thanks in part to favorable weather conditions 14 COLTS that ran the course before all ran to faster course times which ranged from 15 second improvements to Gavi Cepican's 2:46 improvement. There were 118 6th & under boys who completed the course. Kurt Strey was the first COLT across the line in 25th place. Ephraim, Noah and Ethan were the remaining point getters for the boys' team which placed 9th of 14 complete teams. There

were also 118 girls in the 6th & under race. Violet Cepican ran to a medal scoring 3rd place finish only 12 seconds behind first and second. Kendall, Kimberly and Gavi were the remaining scorers for the girls who placed 4th of 12 teams. For the second year in a row, the 8th & under girls pulled off a first place finish thanks to Kaitlyn Crozier joining the team. Hayley Shada, Jayden Schmidt and Ava Stolzman received top 10 finisher medals as they finished in 3rd, 7th and 8th place. Kaitlyn was the final scorer for the team which earned 26 points, only 8 points ahead of Washington County Homeschoolers 34 points. Kaitlyn earned fastest finisher this week for closing the final 100m in 13 seconds. All place finishes and times can be viewed outside the gym entrance. This week the team travels to Centennial Park in Grafton for the Crusading Warriors Invite. GOOOOO TEAM!
