CC Teams Do Great in Grafton

Both girls' teams were awarded 2nd place team plaques following some very tight races against Morning Star and Kennedy Middle School last Wednesday at Centennial Park in Grafton for the Crusading Warrior CC Invite. The younger girls scored 40 points, only two points ahead of Kennedy, and the older girls 35 points were only 6 points ahead of Morning Star. The boys finished in sixth of eleven teams with 109 points. Kurt Strey medaled in 6th place in the sixth grade and under division. Hayley Shada and Violet Cepican each took 2nd in their races for medals. Hope Nickel ran to a fourth place finish and Kendall Boldt snagged the last medal by finishing in tenth. With nearly ideal weather conditions, all thirteen Colts that ran this course before ran their fastest course times which also are now thirteen Colts 2 mile PR times. Cora Schmidt's 3:23 improvement was the most impressive improvement. The team has their work cut out for them this week as they head to KML for the grade school meet on Wednesday and race at Concordia University in Mequon on Saturday for the Lutheran State competition with the potential to qualify for nationals. October is here which means this is the last month for the first quarter. How can that be? Time is going fast, and it is such a blessing to be spending it together with the Lord.


