CC Race Twice Last Week

The CC teams conquered the KML course on Wednesday and then soared at the Lutheran State meet Saturday. The competitive event at KML and state were both two miles in length. The boys fielded a team at KML but were very young in the division. They posted three of the six PR's for the day. The girls also posted three PR's with Leah knocking 41 seconds off her previous best. The girl's 2-mile team raced to a 2nd place team finish with 46 points. The girls ran strong again at State on Saturday finishing in 3rd of 16 schools with 99 points and earning a bid to the National Lutheran Meet at Concordia on October 22. Saturday saw PR's from Jayden Schmidt, Hayley Shada and Gavi Cepican. Thirteen Colts ran to their fastest KML course time in their careers with the improvements ranging from six seconds to Cora Schmidts 1:41. Six Colts also improved their Concordia course times ranging from 21 seconds to Kendall Boldt's 58 second improvement. Nationals will take place on the same course.

CC Travels to Greenfield Park

Participants in Friday's WLC CC Challenge, October 14 will be dismissed at 2:20 for a 2:30 departure time. This meet takes place in Greenfield Park off of Lincoln and 123rd. Girls race at 4:30 and boys at 5:00. Athletes needed to qualify to participate in the Challenge meet.

Qualification standards were placing in the top 40% of a Varsity Race. Three boys and ten girls will be representing COL at this premiere event.
