From Principal Stoltz

Are you tired of arguing with your child about his or her after-school chores? A simple adjustment in your expectations can eliminate those annoying squabbles.

ON DEMAND

“On demand” may work for “pay-per-view” TV, but the same principle applied to the delegation of chores breeds frustration. Telling your child to set the table now disrespects his or her time by tearing the child away from his or her current activity midstream.

ON TIME

Try the “on time” tactic. Set a time expectation for completion of his or her chores. For example, tell your child you need him or her to set the table by 6:00 p.m. Allow him or her to complete the task at his or her convenience, and judge success by finding the table set by the appropriate hour. You will both reach your goals: you will have the table set by dinner, and your child will coordinate his or her chores with his or her other activities.

ON WEEKENDS

You can apply the same principle to weekly chores. Assume you want your child to clean his or her

room each week. Often a parent will demand that Johnny clean his room on Saturday morning “before doing anything else.” But what happens when Johnny must attend a Saturday morning sports event? Use the “on time” tactic, and require your child to complete his cleaning chores by noon on Saturday. Then the youngster can plan his chores around his other activities. He may decide to clean his room Friday after school or Saturday at 11:00 a.m. In either case, the child will successfully reach your goal of having his room in food shape by midday on Saturday.

ON TASK

Substitute the “on time” principle for the “on demand” tactic, and you will realize many benefits. Your child will enjoy your trust and respect. He or she will also grow in self-discipline. And you will eliminate those annoying arguments! This same principle will follow the child into school and the rest of life with having to reach deadlines by certain times or dates.

CC Runs Final Race Saturday

The CC teams close out their season this Saturday racing in the Lutheran Nationals meet at Concordia University in Mequon. The girl's team qualified in the 3rd of 5 team spots at the State Meet and are hoping for some of their best races of the season. Eight girls will be representing Crown of Life in the race that has teams from across the nation coming to compete. Fan support definitely impacts performance. Concordia offers a very spectator friendly, flat, and fast course. The girls race at 12:00. Come cheer them on! Run, COLTS, RUN!

Great Race at Greenfield Park

CC runners ran great at Greenfield Park last Friday for the WLC Grade School Challenge sponsored by Elite Sport and Spine. This was a record breaking year for this challenge with over 50 schools represented and over 400 athletes competing. The challenge requires participants to qualify by placing in the top 40% of a Varsity level competition. Ten Colts represented Crown of Life. Three gained first time experience on this course at this meet. Six of the seven returning ran to their fastest times on the course with Hayley Shada taking a medal for 22nd place finish and setting our new school record at 12:35 which was a 33 second improvement. She joins Ella Stolzman and Taylor Rickaby for getting a time under 13 minutes. The winning time was 11:33. St. John's-Tosa took team honors finishing four runners in the top 36 places. Crown of Life placed 15th of the 24 full teams in attendance. Our four scorers for the meet were Hayley in 22nd followed by Violet Cepican in 74th with a 10 second PR, Jayden Schmidt in 77th (1st time) and Kendall Boldt in 99th with a 2:09 PR. Ephraim Klemann also put our boys in the record book by being the first boy to participate in this event. Weather conditions were breezy and chilly with temperatures dropping as the meet progressed. This Saturday's weather conditions may be much more favorable for faster races! Five will score at Concordia with two additional runners being pushers meaning they push up the score of other teams. In the sport of cross

country the place the runner finishes is what matters the most and every opportunity to pass opponents should be capitalized on. Come and see them in action on Saturday!


Fourth Grade News
