CC Girls Up the Pace

Athletes from more than 60 schools from various states were represented at the Lutheran National meet hosted by Concordia University this past Saturday in Mequon. A warm and sunny 70 degree day with a breeze provided warm conditions for the last race in the 2022 CC Season. The girls had qualified 2 weeks prior at the state meet to race again on the same course. For their 2nd appearance at Nationals, the girls increased their place finish by four places finishing in 6th (up from 10th last year) with 157 points (100 less points from 2021 which is a good thing). Fifth and fourth place were within striking distance only 3 and 10 points away respectively. Four of the Colts set a faster time and a new personal best in the race. Three others were very close to their PR's. Three were awarded All-American Medals for top 21 finish times: Hope Nickel and Violet Cepican ran to a 14:02 finishing in 48th and 49th place and made 2nd Team All American in 12th & 13th place in the 6th and under category. Violet missed a PR by 13 seconds and Hope PR'd by 14 seconds. Jayden Schmidt was next across the line with a PR finish by 26 seconds in 14:12 for 54th place. Our final point getter was Ava Stolzman in 97th with a time of 15:01. Ava bravely finished the season running with shin splints for the final meets of the year. Kendall Boldt (15:57 – 114th) missed a PR by one second, but Aubrey Klemann (16:58 – 154th) knocked 26 seconds off her previous best two mile time. Gavi Cepican posted the greatest improvement (15:52 – 131st) taking her time down by 1:11. Hayley Shada topped off her Colts CC career by leading the team for the 17th and final race. Hayley has three years' worth of history as a Colt and finished with a 17th place finish at Nationals earning 3rd Team 16th place All American Honors in the 7th/8th division. She crossed the line in 13:24 not far from her previous PR. She is the current school record holder for all the distances the cross country team runs. The team also bids farewell to Jayden Schmidt who owns the number two 8th grade female spot for school records in several distances and wore the blue and gold for more than 25 races beginning in 3rd grade. We thank both of these girls for the examples they set and the leadership they provided for the team and wish them well

in all their future endeavors, hoping we might continue to see them on a cross country course!

Gear Up for Cup Stacking

The STACK UP! is our yearly attempt at setting a World Sport Stacking Association (WSSA) World Record for "Most People Sport Stacking at Multiple Locations." Classrooms will report to the gym for stacking sessions throughout the day and all classes will return at the end of the day for an All-School Event.
